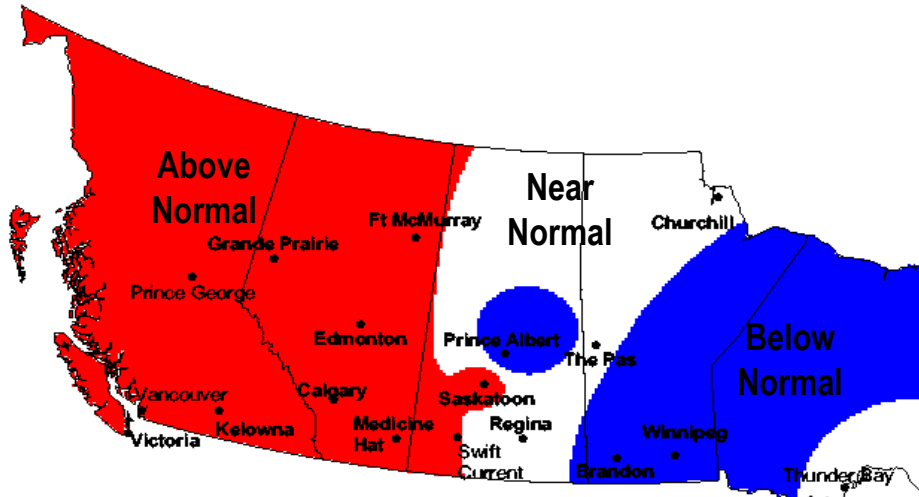
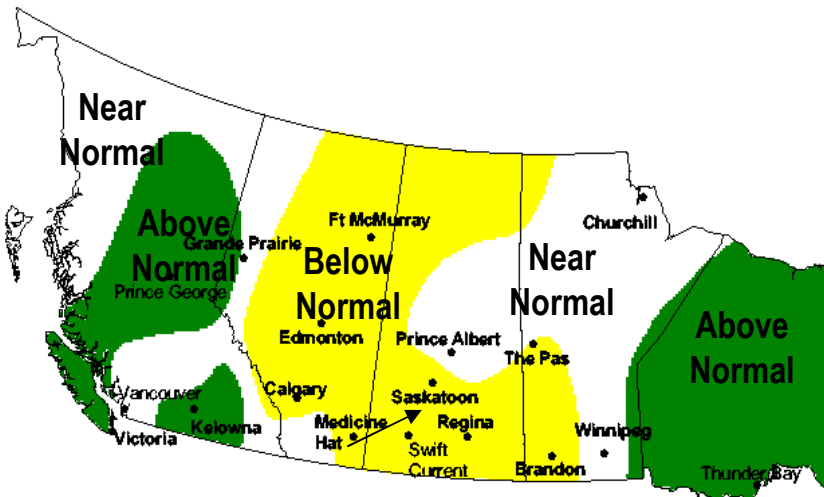

Precipitation



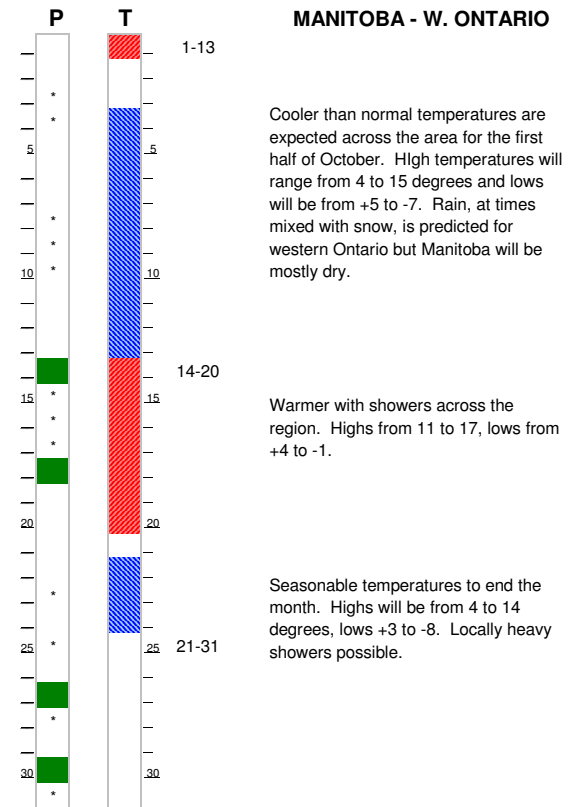
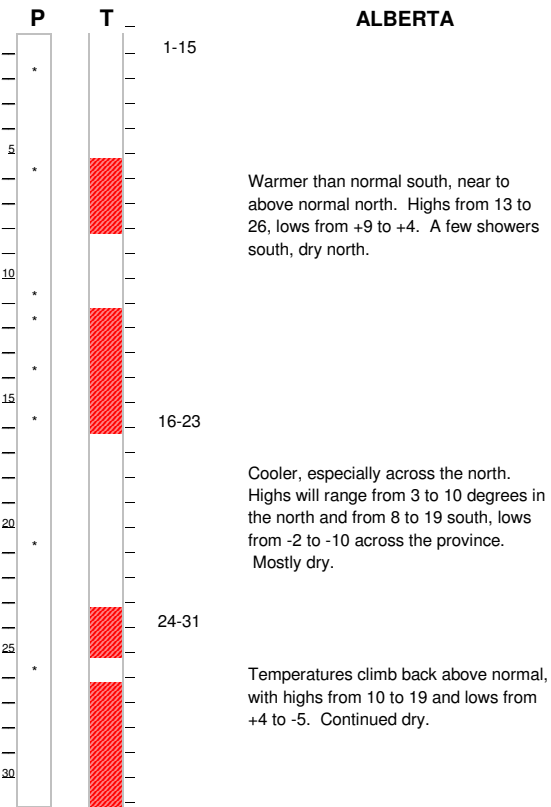
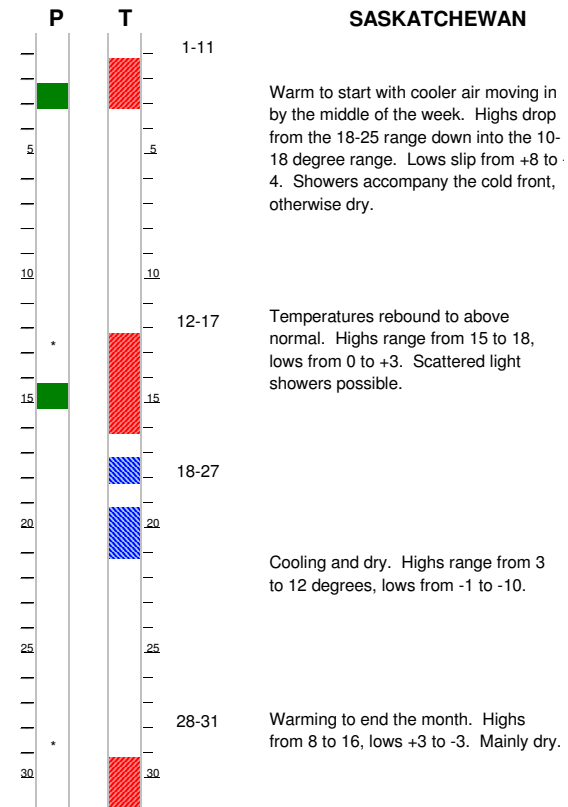
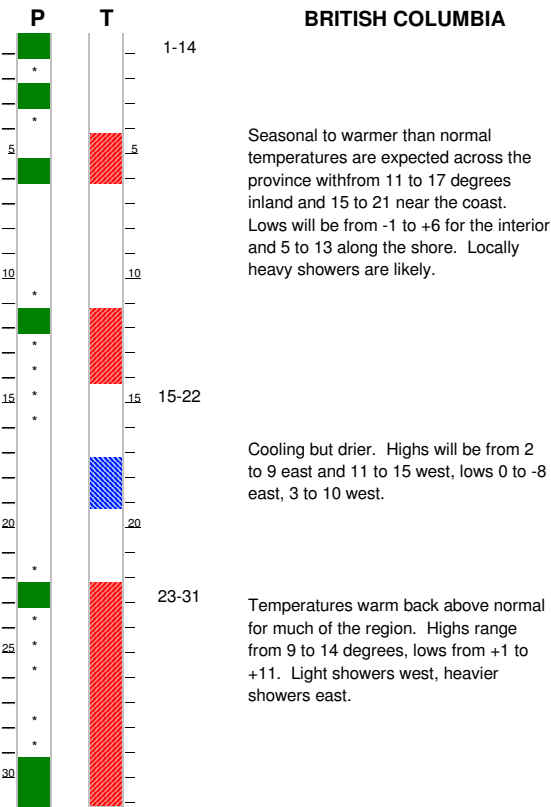

Monthly Climatic Outlook

Temperatures will generally be above normal for the western half of the region, while eastern areas are seasonable to colder than normal. Light precipitation is expected for British Columbia while heavier rain (and some snow mixed in) will fall in western Ontario. The majority of the Prairies will see very dry conditions.
